What is a NID number? Do I need it?

NID stands for National ID Number and is determined by your citizenship. As of January 3, 2018, all individuals dealing in securities need to register a national ID number, NID, in their bank's system. It applies as a global identification code for securities transactions. You simply register an NID with your bank.

What is a LEI Code? Do I need it?

LEI stands for Legal Entity Identifier and is a code used to identify securities trading companies. There is nothing required by private individuals and you do not need it.

Can I deposit the shares in an ISK?

No, ISK can only be used for shares that are listed on a trading venue, which we are not currently.

Is it A or B shares that are up for subscription?

The issue concerns B shares.

How do the various types of shares work?

The main difference is that A shares have one vote per share, while B shares have 1/10 vote per share. All shares have the same right to dividend and attendance at shareholders' meetings and activities.

What is the smallest entry that I can invest in this offer?

The smallest entry that can be purchased is 30 shares of SEK 50, a total of SEK 1500.
